Airport Departure Tax

Airport Transfer

There are 2 options for airport transfer:-

1) Taxi to Hotel – Approx NZ\$50-65 and takes about 40mins

2) Super Shuttle Bus – on-demand door-to-door airport transfer bus. Go to the taxi stand at the airport to get on the Super Shuttle to your hotel. Booking is required for departure to airport. Ask the concierge. For more information, visit <http://www.supershuttle.co.nz/>

Note: The Airbus express only provide routes to the city centre. The hotel and the school are located further north of the city centre.

Weather

Spring lasts from September to November, and New Zealand's spring weather can range from cold and frosty to warm and hot. Because of this, you should be prepared for sudden changes in weather and temperature.

Exchange Rate

Money can be exchanged at the airport, banks and major hotels. ATMs are widely available. Most big cities have ATMs which accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

Tipping

Tipping is becoming more widespread in New Zealand, where there's been more foreign influence. You should tip 5-10% of the bill in a restaurant (not in a counter-service cafe) if you feel you have received exceptional service.

Shopping

Auckland is home to many established and up-and-coming local designers. Check out **Karen Walker** on O'Connell St in the city centre which is also the location of the excellent **MYHART** concept store, stocking avant-garde New Zealand label **Lonely Hearts Club**, as well as Australian designers Tina Kalivas, Josh Goot, and Gail Sorronda.

K' Rd, a local abbreviation of Karangahape Rd, has excellent cultural stores and a large number of pubs and clubs.

Shops are generally open 9am to 5pm from Monday to Friday and 10am to 4pm Saturday and Sunday. Some stores open later on Thursday or Friday evenings.

Victoria Park Market: Open from 9am to 6pm, 7 days a week

A 20min walk west of Queen St, has a huge variety of goods including clothes, pottery, leather work, handicrafts and so on. This is the spot to spend the afternoon searching for that perfect kiwi t-shirt, tiki keyring or lambswool ruggie.

Aotea Square Market: opens from 10am to 6pm, Friday and Saturday only

It is transformed into a little tent city, with around 90 stalls pedalling locally made wares. Expect clothing and jewellery, plus arts and crafts such as ethnic-inspired oils or accessories.

Sightseeing

Sky Tower: Open Sunday to Thursday from 8:30am to 10:30pm, Friday & Saturday from 8:30am to 11:30pm

At 328 metres, this is the tallest tower in the Southern Hemisphere, offering breath-taking views for more than 80 kilometres in every direction.

Coast to Coast Walk

This walking trail takes you through landscapes shaped by 600 years of Maori occupation, and through some of our finest natural and built heritage areas - woodland settings, windswept hills, charming parks and gardens, captivating architectural treasures, and fascinating geological landforms - all offering glimpses of times gone by. You will also experience panoramic views stretching across Auckland city and the region. Most impressive is the vista of Auckland's waterfront playground, the Hauraki Gulf, including the distinctive cone shape of Rangitoto Island.
