Air Transportation

Changi International Airport is recognised as one of the best airports in the world. With 80 airlines serving more than 180 cities in over 50 countries, Changi Airport has established itself as a major aviation hub in the Asia Pacific region. Check out <http://www.changi.airport.com.sg/>

Airport Departure Tax

This should be included in your airline ticket. Please check with your travel agent.

Airport Transfer

Taxis from the Changi International Airport to the city where the hotels are located will cost approximately S\$20-30 and it takes about 15-20 minutes. Surcharges may apply if you are travelling during peak hours (30% surcharge on Weekdays: 7-9.30am and 5-8pm) or after midnight (50% surcharge).

Ground Transportation

Taxis are the most convenient way to get around Singapore. However, during the morning and evening office rush hours and before midnight, it may be difficult to flag a taxi by the road as most taxis will be booked for on-call service

Below are the numbers if you would like to call for a taxi. (Surcharge of S\$3.50 or less will apply for on-call service) You may ask the hotel concierge for assistance if you are departing from hotel.

Note: New Rules as of 1 March 2008, taxis are not allowed to pick up/drop any passenger by the road within CBD area. Please wait at the nearest taxi stand instead.

The Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) in Singapore is a modern, air-conditioned passenger train service with stations all over the island. There are convenient stations at popular destination such as Orchard, Bugis and Chinatown etc.

Introducing the Singapore Tourist Pass

Explore Singapore via our public transport system with **The Singapore Tourist Pass**. Designed to give tourists the best value and ease of travel, the STP is available as 1 - Day, 2 - Day or 3- Day passes at only S\$8 per day. It comes with a rental deposit of S\$10 which is fully refundable if the card is returned within 5 days of issuance.

Alternatively should you desire to have your card delivered to your home country, you can purchase the 1 -Day, 2-Day or 3 -Day pass online.

Weather

Located a mere 1.5 degrees north of the Equator, the weather is usually sunny with no distinct seasons. Rain falls occasionally, usually in sudden, heavy showers that rarely last longer than an hour, so it's wise to carry an umbrella at all times, both as a shade from the sun or cover from the rain.

Exchange Rate

The exchange rate is approximately US\$1 = S\$1.45 (<http://www.oanda.com/convert/classic>). Money can be exchanged at the airport, banks and major hotels. ATMs are widely available. Most big cities have ATMs which accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

Tipping

10% service charge is usually included in the bill. In such cases tipping is not necessary. Tipping of taxi drivers is not customary.

Food & Drink

Water from the tap is safe for drinking. Otherwise you can buy bottled mineral water from convenience stores such as 7-eleven or supermarkets that are almost everywhere!

In Singapore, people don't always eat at restaurant. You can find cheap and good food at non air-conditioned hawker centre or air-conditioned food court.

Below are a few recommended good spots:-

- 1) Newton Circle – Non air-conditioned hawker centre that serves good seafood and other variety. Try the sambal stingray, sambal sotong or chilli crabs if you would like some spicy taste.
- 2) Lau Pa Sat – You can find a whole row of stalls selling chicken, mutton, beef, prawn satay etc from 7pm daily. There are also stalls that sell local food such as laksa, bakt ku teh, hainanese chicken rice & roti prata etc.
- 3) Food Court at Wisma Atria – If you happen to be in Orchard area! There are servers pushing carts selling snacks and drinks apart from the usual food stalls. Prices in food court are generally S\$1-2 higher.

In fact, there is at least one food court in every shopping centre. You will not have any difficulties in finding cheap and good food!

For those who like nightlife, below are a few popular spots:-

- 1) Chijmes – Nearest MRT will be City Hall. There are many restaurants and pubs within the cathedral compound.
- 2) Clarke Quay & Boat Quay – Nearest MRT will be Clarke Quay. Many pubs and discos are located along the riverbank.
- 3) St James Power House – Nearest MRT is Harbour Front. There are several pubs and discos located within the same building with different themes and concepts. You can do bar hopping here and have a taste of various atmospheres ranging from retro to jazz to canto pop.

Shopping

There are several areas in Singapore that are good for shopping:-

- 1) Orchard Road – You will find a whole stretch of shopping centres such as Wisma Atria, Takashimaya, Paragon and Centrepoint etc.
- 2) Marina Square & Suntec City – This is another shopping heaven. Nearest MRT station will be City Hall. You can start your shopping the moment you step out of the train station.
- 3) Bugis Village – This area sells more teenagers stuff. There is also a shopping centre called Bugis Junction.
- 4) Vivocity – This is the newest addition to the shopping scene. Nearest MRT station will be Harbour Front. Sentosa is just across the island.

- 5) Mustafa Centre – 24hour shopping centre that sells almost everything from electronics, clothes to food!
