Maryline has a Licence and a Maitrise in French, German and English as a second languages from the university of Rouen, France. She has also completed a Staatsexamen in French and German literature and linguistics at Koeln University, Germany, and a Diploma of Education at Monash University, Melbourne, Australia.

Maryline taught French and German both as foreign and native languages at various schools in France and Germany before she migrated to Australia in 1985. In 1990 she was employed by Wesley College, Melbourne, the largest coeducational school in the southern hemisphere. Wesley was then in the process of introducing the International Baccalaureate as an alternative to the Australian Victorian Diploma; she was part of the team implementing the IB program in French and German B and A2. She also has coordinated the CAS program, has been the Coordinator of the foreign language faculty and is currently Head of House in the Senior School.

Maryline has been an IB examiner for many years; since 2002 she has been working with IBO as Deputy Chief Examiner for French B. During the last 6 years, she has leaded various IB workshops in the southern hemisphere and has acted as a consultant to teachers of IB and VCE.
