During this period, income increased by 70%; performance measurement systems were introduced and institutionalized; capacity to respond to humanitarian emergencies (war, natural disasters, economic and social unrest) was strengthened and integrated throughout all division; and, supported by UNICEF, the United Nations General Assembly convened a Special Session on Children at which over 180 Governments were represented.
