About IB Examiners

Examiners play an important role in maintaining the quality of assessment for which the IB is known worldwide. The duties of the examiner are to mark externally assessed work or to moderate internally assessed components (reviewing the original marking of teachers).

The IB has examination sessions in both May and November, with examining usually completed within four weeks. Marking in Japanese will take place every November.

Being an IB Examiner provides an international educational experience, encompassing unique professional development opportunities and an insight into the assessment process. Examiners are invited to participate in invaluable online training.

Becoming an IB Examiner

We welcome applications from individuals who have the following:

- a degree or equivalent in the subject, or a related subject, for which they wish to examine
- a minimum of one year's ongoing experience teaching students aged 16 to 19
- access to the internet, via a broadband connection, in an environment that is suitable for marking confidential material
- availability to mark in November
- ability to mark in Japanese and English.
