

Credit/Advanced Standing

This section allows you to determine if your institution awards advanced standing/credit to International Baccalaureate (IB) students. This practice is common in certain institutions, particularly in the United States. By granting university/college credits for IB courses, students can either expedite the completion of their undergraduate degree or fulfill specific program/major requirements.

A new feature now enables universities to input the exact IB courses they offer credits for, including the mandatory minimum grade required to gain the credits for the equivalent university courses. The students are then able to enter their predicted or final IB grades to search for universities that grant credit based on their individual scores. This helps students understand where they might be a good fit academically and select more advanced or alternative courses in place of those that they successfully meet the requirements.

A. Input of Information into Database

- a Selection of Courses
 - On the left side of the chart, you can select an unlimited number of courses to apply the same minimum grade (1 7) requirement and credits (1 –15) offered. Check the box of each course you want to apply the same values to. Using the header bar, you can input the minimum grade and credits you want to apply to the selected courses.
 - Courses that may not have the same minimum requirement or credits can be filled in individually. The minimum grade (1 – 7) and credits (1 – 10) can be selected in each course's individual row.
 - Using this link, <u>All Diploma Programme (DP) subjects</u>, you can find all courses that the IB currently offers and their levels. Using this link, <u>Other DP subjects offered by the IB</u>, you can find all courses that have been discontinued and the courses that have taken their place.

b - Input of Minimum Grade & Credits Offered





 On the top right of the chart, there are two boxes with the "select" feature under "Minimum Grade" and "Credit". In these sections, select the minimum grade students must achieve (1–7) to receive the allocated minimum number of credits offered (1–15). We understand you may grant different credits based on a student's performance; we recommend writing the minimum credits granted to give students a baseline (see 1.3 for more information). Once filled in, click "Apply" for these values to be applied to the selected courses.

c – Individual Input of Equivalency

- After applying the minimum grade and credits offered, the equivalency must be manually input into these sections for each course. You can use special characters, e.g., /, -, +, &. Please be aware that the maximum number of characters is 200.
- Within the "Equivalencies & Comments" section, you can explain these values are the minimum. Depending on higher final grades, students may earn more credit, and their equivalencies may by one of those listed.

Important:

- 1. You can 'apply to all' to an unlimited number of times to allow you to input the different credits and minimum grades to multiple course groups.
- 2. Please note that you cannot 'apply to all' for both HL and SL courses simultaneously. You must do both separately but can follow the same steps outlined above.
- 3. The 39 HL courses and 43 SL courses are a selection of the available and offered courses in the IB programmes. To find courses, such as further languages or additional subjects, please use the bottom sections labeled "Additional language subjects HL/SL" and "Additional other subjects HL/SL".

3. Further Courses

Below the "Higher Level Courses" and "Standard Level Courses" there are additional sections for both "Additional Language Subjects" and "Additional other subjects" – both in HL and SL.

To add additional languages, in the respective HL and SL fields, you can use the drop-down menu to select the languages you offer credits for. Following the same process of selecting the minimum grade (1 - 7), credits (1 - 10), and inputting the equivalency.

Like other languages, the section 'other courses' allows you to select courses from the drop-down menu.
